# GP Discussion Events

Following a period of extensive consultation with local GP practices, Derbyshire Mental Health Services NHS Trust is holding a series of medical discussion evenings, for those in primary care with an interest and involvement in the treatment of specific mental health conditions.

The purpose of the initiative is twofold; to allow practitioners of mental health care in the community the opportunity of exchanging knowledge and views with specialist sector Psychiatrists, and to help strengthen the necessary dialogue for future engagement and communication with Derbyshire Mental Health Services NHS Trust.

The planned programme of events has been constructed around what GPs have told us they want, in terms of the discussion topics of particular interest to them, the venue locations they prefer, the timings of the events, and the session formats.

**The events will be held in the evening of the first Tuesday of each month, alternating between Derby and Chesterfield to ensure county-wide coverage.**

The format for each of the events has been well researched, taking the following broad outline:

## Timing:

- Ashbourne Centre, Derby (7 – 9 pm)
- Education Centre, Chesterfield (7 – 9 pm)

## Hospitality:

Finger buffet & light refreshments (provided before, during and after the event)

## Session content:

- 20-30 minute presentation from Sector Specialist (social, psychological, clinical implications)
- Workshop (case histories)
- Discussion
- Local service information and contact points
